

Mini-Grant Application

What is NEASHC? The Northeast Ag Safety and Health Coalition (NEASHC) is a professional development and networking program for farm safety and health educators. Hailing from Maine to West Virginia, NEASHC members share cutting-edge as well as tried-and-true training methods. They exchange ideas, and they share their individual, specialized knowledge on specific topics. The group meets annually for demonstrations, brainstorming and hands-on trainings to deepen their understanding on a variety of ag safety topics. NEASHC consists of state representatives from nine states, as well as additional members throughout the Northeast region. Membership in NEASHC is free. What are NEASHC Mini-Grants? The NEASHC Mini-Grant is an opportunity for states in the Northeast region to receive \$500 - \$1,000 awards for activities that promote agricultural safety and health in rural communities of the Northeast states. Examples of mini-grant projects include but are not limited to the following examples: health screening (e.g., tetanus shots, skin cancer screenings), farm safety day, building an ag safety demonstration, constructing a safe play area demonstration area. The mini-grant application guidelines are listed below:

- *Eligibility:* Any organization that provides a safety- or health-related service, outreach, or education to people in rural and/or agricultural areas.
- Partnering Requirements: Applicants must partner with a NEASHC State Representative listed in the Coalition Member Directory: https://necenter.org/portfolio/training-for-trainers/.
- Administrative Requirement: sign a short, temporary contract with Bassett Healthcare, and provide a W9.

Grant Awards: Checks will be distributed approximately six - eight weeks following award notification.

Mini-Grant Timeline

- Request for Applications: September 1, 2024
- Application Due: October 31, 2024
- Notification of Awards: Early December 2024
- Project Completion Deadline: No later than August 31, 2025
- Closeout report due 60 days after completion of project

Grant Deliverables

- Present your project at a NEASHC quarterly Zoom meeting within 6 months after the completion of the project. Presentations will be approximately 10 minutes.
- Provide a two-page closeout report that includes an overview of the project, impact, and at least 4 photos.
- Include signed photo release provided to you by Bassett Medical Center.

Application Rules

Applications must be submitted by 5:00 PM ET on October 31, 2024, by emailing them to Pauline Boyer at pauline.boyer@bassett.org.

Is limited to four pages, and you should use a minimum of font size 12.

Preference will be given to those applications that do not include in-direct costs.

Proposed Impact (250 words or less)


Outline the outputs and outcomes for this project.

- Example Output Dermatologist completed 30 skin cancer screenings.
- Example Outcome Five people were referred to their physician

Proposed Budget

Outline, in detail, how the funds will be used for this project. Examples of budget categories include the following:

- Salary/stipend (e.g., guest speaker, dermatologist, etc.)
- Travel
- Materials and supplies (e.g., tetanus shots, materials to build a demonstration, educational handouts, etc.)
- Any other expenses incurred during this project
